What is Alexandroupolis LNG terminal?

The Alexandroupolis LNG Terminal also consists of a subsea and onshore natural gas pipeline. Through the National Natural Gas Transmission System it will deliver natural gas to Greece, Bulgaria, Romania, North Macedonia, Serbia, Moldova and Ukraine in the east, as well as Hungary and Slovakia in the west, Gastrade added.

How has Greece increased its LNG import capacity?

Greece, which typically consumes about 6-7 billion cubic meters of gas a year, has increased capacity for LNG imports through the upgrade of its Revithoussa LNG terminal and the recently completed Alexandroupoli floating storage regassification unit (FSRU).

What infrastructure upgrades are coming to Greece?

Liquefied Natural Gas (LNG) Infrastructure upgrades include the Revithoussa LNG Terminal, which facilitates 30-40% of Greece's total gas needs. The Alexandroupoli FSRU, operated by Gastrade, started commercial operations in October 2024 and increases Greece's import capacity considerably.

How many LNG cargoes did Greece receive in 2022?

DEGAS, Greece's natural gas distributor, operates Greece's only LNG terminal at the island of Revithoussa, which was expanded in 2018 to allow the nation to receive greater quantities of LNG. According to DEGAS, Revithoussa received a record high of 78 LNG cargoes in 2022.
